Meeting with El Dorado County

- Standards for debris cleanup rests with the state
- The standards are the same no matter who is doing or pays for the cleanup
- The FS is taking the county's alternative debris program and modifying it to "fit" the cabins
 - Probably won't be called alternative because we were denied access to state program
 - The FS plan is almost done
 - Mostly it will look like the county's with a few modifications such as hazardous trees (the FS "owns" the trees).
- The FS is planning a "Townhall" for all the burned cabin owners around April 20th to rollout the plan with a letter to each cabin owner the week before.
 - The leadership team have been told we'll get advanced copies of the program and letter

Meeting with El Dorado County (cont.)

- The FS and the county are entering an agreement that the FS will administer the program and that it complies with state and local laws
- Permit administrators (Nancy Platt types) will be the point people for the program (the FS will beef up that area and provide some training to those folks)
- Decision to rebuild based in part on hydrological (100 year flood) and geological.
- Don Ashton (county's Chief Administrative Officer) emphasized we continue our letter writing.
- Mark Woolley was introduced as CCORP's expert on building codes and building permit process. He'll be meeting with the FS and the county to streamline all of this so it's easier on us, the county and the FS.

Debris Removal

BE PATIENT!!!

- Make no commitments until all efforts to get the federal government to pay have been exhausted.
- The letter from the FS about the program will likely have a 15 Oct deadline. Do not take this as an absolute. We are working on it.
- Do not take the FS program as an absolute. It is based upon the county's ordinance. Legally there is wiggle room here that we are and will explore more fully when we see the final program.

Debris Removal

- Insight into the county's program
 - Allows non contractors (cabin owners) to remove the steel, concrete, rock and foundations. (We expect the FS to as well)
 - Any landfill as long as they will accept the material can be used, including those in NV.
 - Per the ordinance, "Fire Debris" is mainly defined as ash. Remaining structures (foundations) are exempt.
- CCORP will put out for bid the cleanup
 - Cabin owners will need to opt in and we will need to group cabins together for economies of scale.

Letter Writing 101...

- Keep it short. No more than one page
- State the problem as simply as possible in the first paragraph
- State the ask/want as near the top as possible and as simply as possible
- Include short personal stories
- If sending email with your letter attached, convert it to pdf
- Modify the letters for the particular audience
- Offer a way to for them to get back to you, e.g. “Please let me know if have any comments, questions or suggestion by contacting me at...”
- Most of the representatives prefer you use their web page to submit “email”. Most will only allow submissions if your address (zip code) is in their district.
- You do not need to have a burned cabin to send letters
- The more letters the better. Have as may family members, friends, etc. send letters.
